The University of Law's new online course 'How to become a lawyer' will help you explore if a career in law is the right fit for you. On this course, you will:

- learn about the nature of the legal sector itself;
- learn about the different routes into law;
- identify the skills needed to succeed as a lawyer and how you can upskill yourself accordingly;
- understand the structures available to support your journey to becoming a lawyer.
